I work at the intersection of international relations, political philosophy, ethics, and history. My work focuses on the ethical spaces of community and the conditions under which and through which peoples agree. These phenomena manifest themselves as models of freedom and communal solidarity based on communicative and processual forms of consensus: the political concept of “togetherness” in the global realm.

Empirically, I have studied the international human rights regime and ASEAN regional integration and I am now writing on what I call the imperative of togetherness – a duty of consensus - emerging from a humanist paradigm of encounters in global life.

I was the ASEAN-Fulbright Visiting Scholar at the American University (SIS) in Washington D.C. (2018), the Taiwan Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA) Fellow at the Institute of Strategic Studies and International Affairs (ISIA) at the National Chung Cheng University (2020-21). I was Senior Fellow at the National Chung Hsing University in Taiwan (2021-22) and was also recently appointed as one of the first four Writing Fellows of 2022 at the Center for Muslim Politics and World Society Studies (COMPOSE) at the Universitas Islam Internasional Indonesia. I am now a fellow in Ethics and International Relations at the University of the Philippines (since 2018).

2.1.2. Togetherness of Peoples: A humanist agenda in a post-Westphalian Age

This article situates my agenda within the discipline of International Relations as a search for a new grammar *beyond* the traditional state-centric narrative. It is a critical postcolonial appeal to the voice of peoples as subjects who have been swept under the domination of an international system largely in the interest of Great Powers. The political concept of togetherness is the imperative of peoples as a political community in a primordial sense. The article essay is important in terms of bringing into the wider debate of order in international relations the significance of decolonization, the struggle for independence, and the emergence of the Global South – and more crucially, the unwanted, undesirable and disposed, symbolized by communities of migrants, refugees, and stateless peoples.

These universities have undertaken joint research, published, created and developed Research Masters and/or European Doctoral Programmes and have created a European Doctoral Enhancement Programme on Peace and Conflict Studies (EDEN).
- **The European Masters in Human Rights and Democratisation or EMA** counts on 41 prestigious European universities, all renowned for their leading role in education, research and advocacy in human rights and democratisation.
- **HumanitarianNet** [www.humanitariannet.deusto.es] involves 87 European universities, 6 centres of research and 9 international organisations, including international NGOs.

- The **World University Network (WUN)** comprising 16 research-intensive institutions has over 30 research initiatives in its portfolio with more than 350 research faculty - spanning 5 continents are active in establishing partnerships that have produced joint publications and shared modules on research degrees, and a coordinated approach to the "Global Challenge" Project (research on Climate Change, Furthering the Frontiers of Cultural Understanding, New Frontiers in Information & Communications Technology, etc.).
