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摘要

Abstract

文藻外語大學是台灣第一也是唯一一所提供複合外語課程和語言研究的高等教育機構。自 2008 年以來，文藻便開著力培育學生東南亞文化和語言能力，並希冀學生能在東南亞市場找到一席之地。2014 年，文藻成立「東南亞語言教學中心」(CSEALT)。因應政府新南行政策和本校在語言教學方面的良好聲譽，文藻今年設立「東南亞碩士學位學程」(MSEAS)，並在 2019 年秋季，新增「東南亞學系」(SEAS)。

「2022 年文藻東南亞國際學術研討會」(2022 Wenzao Ursuline ICSEAS) 為本校第六年辦理之東南亞研討會。在新冠肺炎疫情後，實體及線上混合進行會亦成為常態，本研討會亦採此方式以提供學者多元交流管道，並共探東南亞目前正在進行疫後復甦。會議期間有 59 篇發表，內容含括東南亞國際關係、新冠肺炎疫情衝擊、經濟、企業產業等議題。

Wenzao Ursuline University of Languages is the first and only higher education institution in Taiwan that offers such a multitude of foreign language programs and linguistic research. Since 2008, Wenzao have been equipping our students with Southeast Asian cultural understanding and languages. Wenzao hope the students may find opportunity and be a part of the growth and rise of Southeast Asia. In 2014, Wenzao established the Center for Southeast Asian Language Teaching (CSEALT). With the government's New Southbound Policy and Wenzao's excellent reputation for language instruction, we launched the Master of Southeast Asian Studies program (MSEAS) this year. In the fall of 2019, we also integrated the new Department of Southeast Asian Studies (SEAS).

2021 Wenzao Ursuline International Conference on Southeast Asian Studies (2021 Wenzao Ursuline ICSEAS) is the fifth time of its kind for Wenzao. After the influence of the COVID-19, most of the international conferences adopt a mixed



physical and online approach. The ICSEAS also take this way to provide scholars with multiple communication channels and explore the Recovery of Post-COVID-19 in Southeast Asia. During the conference, 59 articles were presented, covering topics such as Southeast Asian international relations, the impact of the new crown pneumonia epidemic, economics, and corporate industries.

第三章 活動內容概述

文藻外語大學 10 月 21 日舉辦《文藻東南亞國際學術研討會》(2022 Wenzao Ursuline International Conference in Southeast Asian Studies)，以「東南亞：在不確定性中復蘇」為題邀請國外東南亞學者以實體、線上、海報發表等方式齊聚一堂¹，研討東南亞新近發展趨勢。

本研討會自 2017 年舉辦第 1 屆以來，已成為東南亞學系的年度「看板活動」，每年吸引國際外眾多學者參加，歷年累計參加的學者、專家已逾百多人，並於會後並評選優秀論文，出版專書。2019、2021 年更與國際學術期刊《Bandung: the Journal of Global South》合作出版研討會專刊。

2022 年續辦研討會，特別邀請國立成功大學政治系教授宋鎮照擔任專題演講人，以「後疫情時代變遷中的東南亞發展政治經濟學」主題演講，分析及評估東南亞諸國在國家－市場－社會等三個面向，在疫情前後的變化。

此外，研討會作為東南亞研究重要交流管道，為與學者來賓分享本校最新的專書出版資訊，本次特別辦理「專書發表會」，邀請 2021 年研討會專刊《東南亞：壓力下的復甦》主編東南亞學系何啟良客座教授分享選稿及撰稿經驗。會後也將延續往年慣例編譯本研討會英文專書，收錄今年度發表文章，成為每年辦理研討會的學術成果。

第四章 活動新聞報導²

文藻東南亞國際學術研討會 10 國學者聚焦疫後新發展

文藻外語大學日前舉辦「2022 東南亞研究國際學術研討會」，邀請來自加拿大、美國、捷克、斯洛伐克、衣索比亞、越南、泰國、印尼、菲律賓及台灣等 10 國的學者專家出席。他們分別參與現場口頭發表及線上海報發表共 59 篇論文，吸引國內外 200 餘位聽眾參加。研究主題包括我國新南向政策、中國與東南亞關係、東南亞諸國民主現況與經濟發展、移民與海外工作者、泰國政經發展等。會後並舉行《東南亞：壓力下的復甦》英文專書及《台灣與東南亞》中文專書的新書發表會。

文藻外大東南亞學系自 2017 年舉辦首次東南亞研究國際學術研討會 (Wenzao Ursuline International Conference on Southeast Asian Studies, Wenzao Ursuline ICSEAS)，每年皆吸引全球東南亞學者前來發表現研究成果。雖然近二年受新冠肺炎疫情影響，國際移動也受到高度管制，但文藻外大東南亞學系仍然堅持在防疫規定許可之下舉辦實體發表的研討會 ICSEAS，增進學者間互動及學術交流。

近來全球疫情趨緩，各國逐步開放邊境，今年第六屆的 ICSEAS 放公告徵稿時，吸引近百餘位來自全球各地的學者投稿，後來雖因台灣邊境政策開放較為審謹，以致部分學者專家後來改以線上海報發表，但仍然有 37 篇論文實體發表。

此外，今年會議邀請國立成功大學政治經濟研究所教授宋鎮照發表「後疫情時代變遷中的東南亞發展政治經濟學」主題演講，分析及評估東南亞諸國在國家—市場—社會等三個面向，在疫情前後的變化。

文藻外大東南亞學系也於研討會中舉辦中英文專書發表會，與知名英文學術期刊「Bandung: the Global South」合作編輯的東亞研究特輯也將於明年初出版。

第六章 成果效益

透過各國學者針對東南亞各國與東協之政策、現象、文學等面向的解析與比較，匯集於台灣這個具地理優勢之小島。有鑑於東南亞在全球事務中的關鍵性正在快速上升，臺灣與東南亞國家，無論是進出口貿易、投資、人口移動亦是日益深厚。文藻外語大學東南亞學系邀請來自越南、印尼、泰國、馬來西亞、土耳其等在台年青學者，一同探究東南亞諸國的政經情勢、區域關係及台灣新南向政策，不僅增進參與各方對東南亞整體暨個別國家的認識與了解，也有助於國內外東南亞學術社群的建立，更藉著深化跨領域、跨文化的交流，為擴展臺灣與東南亞良好關係增添知識上的助力。

為延續本校辦理東南亞研討會的豐碩的成果，擬定研討會後出版一本論文英文專書。今年度專書將以《Southeast Asia: Recovery amidst Uncertainty》為題，邀請研討會發表者針對新冠肺炎疫情衝擊、政經、文化、國際關係等主題為文，促進臺灣對於東南亞事務研究之貢獻。

此次研討會辦理，於知識上，參加者發表論文並深度討論及對話，深化對學科知識的貢獻；學術發展上，與會者將合力深化立足於臺灣的東南亞研究。文藻大學與臺灣學術界將面向世界，展現自身成為全球東南亞事務之領航者的企圖與能力；實務意義上，與會者從諸多不同角度：跨領域、跨產業研討區域內現實議題，藉此可作為台灣借鏡，並與創新產學實務連結。綜觀本次研討會之辦理，可歸結以下成果：

- 第一、 增進臺灣在東南亞學術研究的國際能見度與重要性。
- 第二、 提升國內年輕學者對東南亞研究的興趣與動力。
- 第三、 推廣國內學術界對東南亞的認識，深化跨文化的交流，以提升我國與東南亞的良好關係。
- 第四、 促進國際學者對台灣及大高雄地區的認識。
- 第五、 建立文藻作為南台灣東南亞學術和政策研究的重鎮，整合東南亞相關國家、大學的東南亞研究中心，成為跨國平台。



財團法人臺灣民主基金會簡介

緣起與成立

臺灣民主轉型成功，不僅是兩千三百萬臺灣人民值得驕傲的歷史性成就，更是國際社會讚賞的焦點。此一轉型並非一朝一夕所能完成，而是經歷了一段漫長的爭自由、爭人權的過程。這段歷史見證吾人追求民主、人權之過程。

基此，為積極鞏固我國民主與人權進步實績、回饋國際對我長期的堅定支持與協助，同時藉由參與全球民主力量網路的聯繫，促進我國參與全球民主政黨及相關組織之活動，財團法人臺灣民主基金會之設立理念於焉成型。

外交部自二〇〇二年即積極推動籌設，經過長期資料蒐整及審慎評估後，結合我國產、官、學及民間等各方面人力、經驗與資金，在朝野各政黨之支持下，於二〇〇三年元月獲立法院審查通過預算。二〇〇三年六月十七日，財團法人臺灣民主基金會在召開首屆董事暨監察人會議後正式成立，立法院王院長金平獲推舉擔任首屆董事長。依照章程規定，十五位董事分別依照比例，由來自政府、政黨、學界、非政府組織，以及企業界的代表出任。

宗旨

做為亞洲地區所建立的第一個國家級民主基金會，臺灣民主基金會的基本理念是在全民共識的基礎上，建立一個永續經營、具遠景並運作透明化的超黨派機構，透過凝聚政黨、民間組織力量，共同為擴大臺灣參與全球民主接軌及鞏固民主實績而努力。

依照章程，基金會設立宗旨包括：

- 與民主國家相關社團、政黨、智庫及非政府組織（NGOs）等建構合作夥伴關係，並與國際民主力量接軌，有效凝集世界民主力量，拓展我國國際活動空間。
- 支持亞洲及世界各地之民主化，與全球各地民主領袖建立密切合作及聯繫網絡，並致力推動全球民主發展。
- 透過全球學術界、智庫、國會、政黨等管道推動民主教育及國際交流，提升臺灣民主素質，鞏固民主發展。

工作方向

財團法人臺灣民主基金會係由政府贊助設立，惟仍屬獨立運作的、超黨派的組織，依據章程，基金會得接受國內外民間捐款。基金會五分之一預算保留作為各主要政黨申請從事國內、外民主人權相關活動之用；其餘五分之四則作為推動各項業務之經費。

本會業務推動範圍包括：

- 推動與世界各國民主組織建立結盟關係。
- 支持國內外學術界、智庫、民間非政府組織推展有關民主與人權之活動。
- 支援國內各政黨從事國會外交及國際民主交流活動。
- 發掘國內外民主發展問題、研發政策並發行書刊。
- 推動有關民主、人權之研討會，舉辦公論壇及相關民主教育活動。



Taiwan Foundation for Democracy

Background

Taiwan's peaceful transition to democracy is not only a historical accomplishment for its twenty-three million people, but a landmark in the worldwide spread of democracy. Only after years of struggle and effort could this transformation take place. We must never forget this history, for it shapes the cornerstone of our continued commitment to the principles of democracy and human rights.

The Foundation was established with an inter-related, two-tracked mission in mind. Domestically, the TFD strives to play a positive role in consolidating Taiwan's democracy and fortifying its commitment to human rights; internationally, the Foundation hopes to become a strong link in the world's democratic network, joining forces with related organizations around the world. Through the years, Taiwan has received valuable long-term assistance and stalwart support from the international community, and it is now time to repay that community for all of its efforts.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs initiated the Taiwan Foundation for Democracy project in 2002. After much research and careful evaluation, the Ministry integrated the required resources from many sectors of society. In January 2003, the Ministry obtained the support of all political parties to pass the budget for the Foundation in the legislature. The TFD formally came into being on June 17, 2003, with its first meeting of the Board of Trustees and Supervisory Board. At that meeting, Legislative Yuan President Wang Jin-pyng was elected its first chairman. According to its By-laws, the TFD is governed by a total of fifteen trustees and five supervisors, representing political parties, the government, academia, non-governmental organizations, and the business sector.

Mission

The Taiwan Foundation for Democracy (TFD) is the first democracy assistance foundation to be established in Asia, and is devoted to strengthening democracy and human rights in Taiwan and abroad. Its primary concerns are to further consolidate Taiwan's democratic system, promote democracy in Asia, and actively participate in the global democratic network.

The TFD will put its ideals into practice through farsighted, transparent, and non-partisan management. Building on the strength of both political parties and civil society, the TFD will enable Taiwan to positively contribute to the worldwide movement for democracy. According to its By-laws, the Foundation's mission is as follows:

- Work with the international community to strengthen democracy around the globe and expand Taiwan's participation in international activities;
- Support democratization in Asia and the rest of the world by establishing close relationships with leaders of the world's democracies and cooperative partnerships with civil society groups, political parties, think tanks, and non-governmental organizations in democratic countries; and
- Elevate Taiwan's democracy and further consolidate its democratic development by promoting education in democracy and international exchanges among academic circles, think tanks, parliaments, and political parties from the world over.

Our Tasks

The primary source of funding for the TFD is the government. However, it is independently incorporated, non-partisan, and non-profit. According to its By-laws, the Foundation may accept international and domestic donations. One fifth of its budget is reserved for Taiwan's political parties, supporting their own international and local initiatives that are in line with the mission of the TFD. The remaining budget is used for the TFD core activities, including:

- Building relationships with related institutions around the world;
- Participating actively in the global promotion of democracy and supporting the improvement of human rights conditions;
- Supporting democracy promotion activities of NGOs and academic institutions;
- Promoting research and publications on democratic developments at home and abroad; and
- Holding seminars, workshops, conferences, and other educational activities in the area of democracy and human rights.

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摘要

Abstract

文藻外語大學是台灣第一也是唯一一所提供複合外語課程和語言研究的高等教育機構。自 2008 年以來，文藻便開著力培育學生東南亞文化和語言能力，並希冀學生能在東南亞市場找到一席之地。2014 年，文藻成立「東南亞語言教學中心」(CSEALT)。因應政府新南行政策和本校在語言教學方面的良好聲譽，文藻今年設立「東南亞碩士學位學程」(MSEAS)，並在 2019 年秋季，新增「東南亞學系」(SEAS)。

「2023 年文藻東南亞國際學術研討會」(2023 Wenzao Ursuline ICSEAS) 為本校第七年辦理之東南亞研討會。在新冠肺炎疫情後，實體及線上混合進行會亦成為常態，本研討會亦採此方式以提供學者多元交流管道，並共探東南亞目前正在進行疫後復甦。會議期間有 45 篇發表，內容含括東南亞的國際關係、政治、教育、文化等議題。

Wenzao Ursuline University of Languages is the first and only higher education institution in Taiwan that offers such a multitude of foreign language programs and linguistic research. Since 2008, Wenzao have been equipping our students with Southeast Asian cultural understanding and languages. Wenzao hope the students may find opportunity and be a part of the growth and rise of Southeast Asia. In 2014, Wenzao established the Center for Southeast Asian Language Teaching (CSEALT). With the government's New Southbound Policy and Wenzao's excellent reputation for language instruction, we launched the Master of Southeast Asian Studies program (MSEAS) this year. In the fall of 2019, we also integrated the new Department of Southeast Asian Studies (SEAS).

"2023 Wenzao Ursuline International Conference on Southeast Asian Studies" (2023 Wenzao Ursuline ICSEAS) is the seventh annual conference held by our university focusing on Southeast Asian studies. In the aftermath of the COVID-19



pandemic, a hybrid format combining physical and online participation has become the norm. This conference also adopts this approach to provide scholars with diverse channels for exchange and to jointly explore the ongoing post-pandemic recovery in Southeast Asia. During the conference, a total of 45 papers will be presented, covering topics such as Southeast Asian international relations, politics, education, culture, and more.

第三章 活動內容概述

文藻外語大學 10 月 19-21 日舉辦《文藻東南亞國際學術研討會》(2023 Wenzao Ursuline International Conference in Southeast Asian Studies)，以「Southeast Asia: Regionalization and its Discontents」為題邀請國外東南亞學者以實體、線上、海報發表等方式齊聚一堂，研討東南亞新近發展趨勢。

本研討會自 2017 年舉辦第 1 屆以來，已成為東南亞學系的年度「看板活動」，每年吸引國際外眾多學者參加，歷年累計參加的學者、專家已逾百多人，並於會後並評選優秀論文，出版專書。2019、2021 年更與國際學術期刊《Bandung: the Journal of Global South》合作出版研討會專刊。

2023 年續辦研討會，特別邀請威斯康辛大學麥迪遜分校榮譽教授 Thongchai Winichakul 發表「不滿記憶對民主的影響」主題演講，分析過去歷史對現今變化的影響。此外本次共計 16 場次發表 45 篇論文，由來自 8 國學者、專家發表演講及研究成果。在新冠疫情影響後，各國多採實體、線上混合方式進行學術研討，本研討會亦延續此型態，於越南語發表場次採取現場及線上口頭發表方式進行，營造學術研究傳播與學者交流的新型平臺。

此外，研討會作為東南亞研究重要交流管道，為與學者來賓分享本校最新的專書出版資訊，主辦的東南亞學系每年皆有專書出版計畫，本次邀請 2022 年研討會專刊《東南亞：壓力下的復甦》主編東南亞學系何啟良特聘教授分享選稿及撰稿經驗。會後也將延續往年慣例編譯本研討會英文專書，收錄今年度發表文章，成為每年辦理研討會的學術成果。



第四章 活動新聞報導

8 國學者齊聚文藻，研討東南亞的「反抗者」

文藻外語大學東南亞學系 2023 年 10 月 19-21 日舉辦第七屆「文藻東南亞研究國際學術研討會」(Wenzao International Conference in Southeast Asian Studies, Wenzao ICSEAS)，共有來自全球 8 國學者、專家齊聚文藻，研討東南亞的區域主義及「反抗者」(Regionalism and Its Discontent)，共有 16 場次發表 45 篇論文，主題涵括台灣的新南向政策、東南亞與台灣、東南亞區域關係、東南亞歷史、東南亞產業經濟等。

文藻東南亞學系自 2017 年起每年舉辦 Wenzao ICSEAS，3 年新冠疫情期間依然持續辦理，2023 Wenzao ICSEAS 可算是疫情結束後，回復疫情常態的第一年，在徵文公告於今年 2 月發佈後，即收到超過 80 多篇的投稿，經會議執行委員會審議後，共接受 45 篇論文。

與會學者專家除本地學者專家外，也吸引到美國、土耳其、印尼、泰國、越南、馬來西亞、新加坡、菲律賓等國學者、專家。會議雖以英語作為發表語言，但也安排越南語、印尼語發表的場次，顯示東南亞研究的兼容並蓄。

會議主題演講由美國威斯康辛·麥迪遜分校 (University of Wisconsin, Madison) 歷史系榮譽教授通猜·威尼差恭以「反抗者的默然記憶與對民主的意涵」(Silent Memories of Discontents and Implications on Democracy) 為題，場次主題包括東南亞史學、東南亞宗教、東南亞經濟產業、東協研究、東南亞社會與教育、台灣新南向政策、東南亞與台灣關係等、越南語言教學、印尼發展研究等。

本次會議也首次邀請五南圖書出版集團轄下的桂林圖書，安排東南亞研究專書主題展，供與會學者專家參考，同時特別舉辦《東南亞：不確定中的復甦》(Southeast Asia: Recovery Amidst Uncertainty)，以及《台灣與東南亞：面對中國優勢的軟實力與硬事實》英文專書 (Taiwan and Southeast Asia: Soft Power and Hard Truths Facing China's Ascendancy) 的發表與研討。兩本書的編者與作者群始於參加 Wenzao ICSEAS 時所建立的友誼與學術鏈結，可說是會議最後的成



果。

會議後，與會各國學者亦在文藻「我們的城市」(Our Town 社區永續)大學社會責任計畫安排下走訪左營舊城，瞭解高雄的城市發展。

第六章 成果效益

透過各國學者針對東南亞各國與東協之政策、現象、文學等面向的解析與比較，匯集於台灣這個具地理優勢之小島。有鑑於東南亞在全球事務中的關鍵性正在快速上升，臺灣與東南亞國家，無論是進出口貿易、投資、人口移動亦是日益深厚。文藻外語大學東南亞學系邀請來自越南、印尼、泰國、馬來西亞、土耳其等在台年青學者，一同探究東南亞諸國的政經情勢、區域關係及台灣新南向政策，不僅增進參與各方對東南亞整體暨個別國家的認識與了解，也有助於國內外東南亞學術社群的建立，更藉著深化跨領域、跨文化的交流，為擴展臺灣與東南亞良好關係增添知識上的助力。

為延續本校辦理東南亞研討會的豐碩的成果，擬定研討會後出版一本論文英文專書。今年度專書將以《Southeast Asia: Regionalization and its Discontents》為題，邀請研討會發表者針對區域政治、政經、文化、國際關係等主題為文，促進臺灣對於東南亞事務研究之貢獻。此次辦理，於知識上，參加者發表論文並深度討論及對話，深化對學科知識的貢獻；學術發展上，與會者將合力深化立足於臺灣的東南亞研究。文藻大學與臺灣學術界將面向世界，展現自身成為全球東南亞事務之領航者的企圖與能力；實務意義上，與會者從諸多不同角度：跨領域、跨產業研討區域內現實議題，藉此可作為台灣借鏡，並與創新產學實務連結。

綜觀本次研討會之辦理，可歸結以下成果：

- 第一、增進臺灣在東南亞學術研究的國際能見度與重要性。
- 第二、提升國內年輕學者對東南亞研究的興趣與動力。
- 第三、推廣國內學術界對東南亞的認識，深化跨文化的交流，以提升我國與東南亞的良好關係。
- 第四、促進國際學者對台灣及大高雄地區的認識。
- 第五、建立文藻作為南台灣東南亞學術和政策研究的重鎮，整合東南亞相關國家、大學的東南亞研究中心，成為跨國平台。



財團法人臺灣民主基金會簡介

緣起與成立

臺灣民主轉型成功，不僅是兩千三百萬臺灣人民值得驕傲的歷史性成就，更是國際社會讚賞的焦點。此一轉型並非一朝一夕所能完成，而是經歷了一段漫長的爭自由、爭人權的過程。這段歷史見證吾人追求民主、人權之過程。

基此，為積極鞏固我國民主與人權進步實績、回饋國際對我長期的堅定支持與協助，同時藉由參與全球民主力量網路的聯繫，促進我國參與全球民主政黨及相關組織之活動，財團法人臺灣民主基金會之設立理念於焉成型。

外交部自二〇〇二年即積極推動籌設，經過長期資料蒐整及審慎評估後，結合我國產、官、學及民間等各方面人力、經驗與資金，在朝野各政黨之支持下，於二〇〇三年元月獲立法院審查通過預算。二〇〇三年六月十七日，財團法人臺灣民主基金會在召開首屆董事暨監察人會議後正式成立，立法院王院長金平獲推舉擔任首屆董事長。依照章程規定，十五位董事分別依照比例，由來自政府、政黨、學界、非政府組織，以及企業界的代表出任。

宗旨

做為亞洲地區所建立的第一個國家級民主基金會，臺灣民主基金會的基本理念是在全民共識的基礎上，建立一個永續經營、具遠景並運作透明化的超黨派機構，透過凝聚政黨、民間組織力量，共同為擴大臺灣參與全球民主接軌及鞏固民主實績而努力。

依照章程，基金會設立宗旨包括：

- 與民主國家相關社團、政黨、智庫及非政府組織（NGOs）等建構合作夥伴關係，並與國際民主力量接軌，有效凝集世界民主力量，拓展我國國際活動空間。
- 支持亞洲及世界各地之民主化，與全球各地民主領袖建立密切合作及聯繫網絡，並致力推動全球民主發展。
- 透過全球學術界、智庫、國會、政黨等管道推動民主教育及國際交流，提升臺灣民主素質，鞏固民主發展。

工作方向

財團法人臺灣民主基金會係由政府贊助設立，惟仍屬獨立運作的、超黨派的組織，依據章程，基金會得接受國內外民間捐款。基金會五分之一預算保留作為各主要政黨申請從事國內、外民主人權相關活動之用；其餘五分之四則作為推動各項業務之經費。

本會業務推動範圍包括：

- 推動與世界各國民主組織建立結盟關係。
- 支持國內外學術界、智庫、民間非政府組織推展有關民主與人權之活動。
- 支援國內各政黨從事國會外交及國際民主交流活動。
- 發掘國內外民主發展問題、研發政策並發行書刊。
- 推動有關民主、人權之研討會，舉辦公共論壇及相關民主教育活動。



Taiwan Foundation for Democracy

Background

Taiwan's peaceful transition to democracy is not only a historical accomplishment for its twenty-three million people, but a landmark in the worldwide spread of democracy. Only after years of struggle and effort could this transformation take place. We must never forget this history, for it shapes the cornerstone of our continued commitment to the principles of democracy and human rights.

The Foundation was established with an inter-related, two-tracked mission in mind. Domestically, the TFD strives to play a positive role in consolidating Taiwan's democracy and fortifying its commitment to human rights; internationally, the Foundation hopes to become a strong link in the world's democratic network, joining forces with related organizations around the world. Through the years, Taiwan has received valuable long-term assistance and stalwart support from the international community, and it is now time to repay that community for all of its efforts.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs initiated the Taiwan Foundation for Democracy project in 2002. After much research and careful evaluation, the Ministry integrated the required resources from many sectors of society. In January 2003, the Ministry obtained the support of all political parties to pass the budget for the Foundation in the legislature. The TFD formally came into being on June 17, 2003, with its first meeting of the Board of Trustees and Supervisory Board. At that meeting, Legislative Yuan President Wang Jin-pyng was elected its first chairman. According to its By-laws, the TFD is governed by a total of fifteen trustees and five supervisors, representing political parties, the government, academia, non-governmental organizations, and the business sector.

Mission

The Taiwan Foundation for Democracy (TFD) is the first democracy assistance foundation to be established in Asia, and is devoted to strengthening democracy and human rights in Taiwan and abroad. Its primary concerns are to further consolidate Taiwan's democratic system, promote democracy in Asia, and actively participate in the global democratic network.

The TFD will put its ideals into practice through farsighted, transparent, and non-partisan management. Building on the strength of both political parties and civil society, the TFD will enable Taiwan to positively contribute to the worldwide movement for democracy. According to its By-laws, the Foundation's mission is as follows:

- Work with the international community to strengthen democracy around the globe and expand Taiwan's participation in international activities;
- Support democratization in Asia and the rest of the world by establishing close relationships with leaders of the world's democracies and cooperative partnerships with civil society groups, political parties, think tanks, and non-governmental organizations in democratic countries; and
- Elevate Taiwan's democracy and further consolidate its democratic development by promoting education in democracy and international exchanges among academic circles, think tanks, parliaments, and political parties from the world over.

Our Tasks

The primary source of funding for the TFD is the government. However, it is independently incorporated, non-partisan, and non-profit. According to its By-laws, the Foundation may accept international and domestic donations. One fifth of its budget is reserved for Taiwan's political parties, supporting their own international and local initiatives that are in line with the mission of the TFD. The remaining budget is used for the TFD core activities, including:

- Building relationships with related institutions around the world;
- Participating actively in the global promotion of democracy and supporting the improvement of human rights conditions;
- Supporting democracy promotion activities of NGOs and academic institutions;
- Promoting research and publications on democratic developments at home and abroad; and
- Holding seminars, workshops, conferences, and other educational activities in the area of democracy and human rights.

文藻外語大學是臺灣第一也是唯一一所提供複合外語課程和語言研究的高等教育機構。自 2008 年以來，文藻便開著力培育學生東南亞文化和語言能力，並希冀學生能在東南亞市場找到一席之地。2014 年，文藻成立「東南亞語言教學中心」(CSEALT)。因應政府新南行政策和本校在語言教學方面的良好聲譽，文藻今年設立「東南亞碩士學位學程」(MSEAS)，並在 2019 年秋季，新增「東南亞學系」(SEAS)。

「2024 年文藻東南亞國際學術研討會」(2024 Wenzao Ursuline ICSEAS) 為本校第 8 年辦理之東南亞研討會。在歷經新冠肺炎疫情後，逐步恢復為完全實體發表，本研討會亦採此方式以提供學者多元交流管道，並共探東南亞目前正在進行疫後復甦。會議期間有 71 篇發表，內容含括東南亞的國際關係、政治、教育、文化等議題。

Wenzao Ursuline University of Languages is the first and only higher education institution in Taiwan that offers such a multitude of foreign language programs and linguistic research. Since 2008, Wenzao have been equipping our students with Southeast Asian cultural understanding and languages. Wenzao hope the students may find opportunity and be a part of the growth and rise of Southeast Asia. In 2014, Wenzao established the Center for Southeast Asian Language Teaching (CSEALT). With the government's New Southbound Policy and Wenzao's excellent reputation for language instruction, we launched the Master of Southeast Asian Studies program (MSEAS) this year. In the fall of 2019, we also integrated the new Department of Southeast Asian Studies (SEAS).

The "2024 Wenzao Ursuline International Conference on Southeast Asian Studies" (2024 Wenzao Ursuline ICSEAS) marks the eighth year that our university has organized this conference on Southeast Asian studies. After the challenges of the



COVID-19 pandemic, the conference has returned to an in-person format to facilitate diverse exchanges among scholars and to jointly explore Southeast Asia's ongoing post-pandemic recovery. During the conference, 71 presentations will be delivered, covering topics such as Southeast Asia's international relations, politics, education, and culture.

第三章 活動內容概述

第一節 全球政經變遷略探

文藻外語大學 2024 年 10 月 17-19 日舉辦《文藻東南亞國際學術研討會》(2024 Wenzao Ursuline International Conference in Southeast Asian Studies)。首日(10 月 17 日)以臺灣東南亞研究學界巨擘之一的顧長永教授三十多年來的研究、教學及其熱心投入台灣與東南亞交流的活動為主題，舉辦「臺灣東南亞研究與教育論壇：顧長永教授的學術旅程」(Southeast Asian Studies and Education in Taiwan: The Journey of Professor Samuel C. Y. Ku)。論壇由東南亞學系林文斌主任主持，有來自國內外的專家、學者，以及學生參加，將現場擠得水泄不通。

論壇區分四個段落，首先由林主任以中英文雙語簡介顧教授學經歷及著作，並以「著作等身、桃李天下」表彰顧教授的教研成就。林主任表示，經計算迄 2024 年 10 月中旬，顧教授著有中英學術期刊論文 57 篇、專書論文 23 篇、中英專書 16 本，還有 1 本即將出版！在指導學生論文寫作上，計有 176 位，其中博士論文 33 本，143 本碩士論文！第二段則以照片簡介顧教授的教研歷程，展示出顧教授在學術勤於述、足跡遍及東南亞，並藉舉辦東南亞台商企業研習團、東南亞事務研習營，熱心推廣台灣與東南亞的交流。第三段則邀請曾受惠顧教授指導的碩、博士畢業生表達與顧教授的師生之誼。親自到場的有翁俊桔教授，是顧教授指導的第二位博士畢業生，以及最近的博士畢業生—魏愛妮教授。而在泰國的何展傑教授也線上參加表達感謝與祝福。其他未能即時參與者，也以錄影表達對顧教授的感謝，並分享師生之間的故事，如韓國新羅大學李權鎬教授、在菲律賓經營社會企業的阿莉亞 (Aliya)，暨南大學司徒宇教授、蕭文軒博士，以及顧老師第一、二位碩士指導學生—樹德科大資訊中心專員丁銘泉，駐加拿大副代表邴兆魯等。第四段則由顧教授的博士班同期、何啟良教授分享他對顧教授的相知相惜友誼，最後由顧教授發表感言。

第二日(10 月 18 日)則為正式研討，以「國家、市場、社會」(Southeast



Asia: State vs Market vs Society) 為題邀請各方學者探討東南亞國家、市場力量和社會結構之間錯綜複雜的動態關係，並邀請馬來西亞知名的學者、公共知識份子 (Public Intellectual)，現任雙威大學教授的 Chin-Huat Wong (黃進發) 教授發表「民粹主義：不滿經濟、不信國家、裂解社會」(Populism - Discontent over economy, Distrust of State and Disruption in Society) 主題演講，探討東南亞地區的民粹主義，其定義、成因和潛在威脅。黃教授指出民粹主義領袖往往將自己描繪成人民的代言人，反對精英階層和「他人」，並利用社會不滿和政治腐敗等因素來獲得支持，亦分析了民粹主義對民主體制的威脅，以及對抗民粹主義的可能性，即建立健全的政黨體系和促進多元化政治文化。最後拋出以下議題討論東南亞地區面臨的未來挑戰，諸如印尼普拉博沃·蘇比安托總統在其領導下將採取何種民粹主義傾向、如何在東南亞民主國家中有效建立政黨制度化、如何減輕技術引發的失業和氣候變化帶來的負面影響等。

黃教授精闢見解為本校連續第 8 年舉辦東南亞國際學術會議揭開序幕。拜疫情舒緩所賜，本次發表論文超過 70 篇、逾百位、來自近 20 個不同國家學者分享東南亞豐富而多元的主題。亦拜本研討會每年累積的好口碑，吸引許多新舊朋友參加，本次首次有來自印尼東爪哇泗水的 Airlangga University，共計 23 名教師及學生組團參加，為舉辦至今最大的學者群體，其中有 4 位大學生在教師指導下聯合發表一篇論文，亦獲得評論人好評。其次，本次延續過往特色，組織兩場越南文發表場次，讓越南學者可以盡情自在發表及討論。就參與本次研討會的學者，好幾位學者已經連續參加數次，如來自菲律賓大學政治系 Jorge Tigno 教授幾乎每年都參加。今年參加的菲律賓學者約有 15 人，是第二大學者群體。至於參加 3 次以上的學者，亦有 5 人以上。許多東南亞學者穿著自己國家的服裝，發表有關當地議題的論文，著顯東南亞多元特色。

研討會作為東南亞研究重要交流管道，為與學者來賓分享本校最新的專書出版資訊，主辦的東南亞學系每年皆有專書出版計畫，本次閉幕式時，由林文主任簡介 2023 年研討會成果、《東南亞：利益與不滿》(Southeast Asia: Interests and Discontents) 的新書發表，並延續往年慣例編譯本次，研討會英文專書由魏愛妮教授、陳正娟教授以 2024 年專書主編的身份，公告選文及編輯方針。最後



林文斌主任再次以三個感謝向顧長永教授致敬「因著顧教授的熱心推動，我們才能有 Wenzao ICSEAS，共聚一堂；我們才能連續出版英文專書，分享研究成果；我們才能有文藻東南亞學系，培育學生，促進台灣與東南亞的交流」，獲得在場專家學者們熱烈的掌聲。

會議最後一日（10 月 19 日）並安排學者們「城市之旅」，前往知名觀光工廠，瞭解台灣的紡織成衣業的發展與技術成長，並安排學者們 T 恤手作。之後也前往地標性百貨公司，體驗高雄的城市發展，為本次研討會旅程畫下多元而豐富的句點。

第二節 發表主題初探

各方學者帶來豐富主題，探索東南亞區域合作、政治與領導風格、旅遊發展、社會行為、經濟政策和文化遺產等發展與變遷，可分類為以下範疇描述：

一、臺灣相關議題：

- 臺灣與東南亞的區域安全合作：探討了越南如何應對中國在南海的灰色地帶戰術，並強調越南與臺灣在加強海上安全合作的潛力。這顯示臺灣在南海區域安全議題中扮演著重要角色，且與越南等東南亞國家存在合作空間。
- 新南向政策與臺灣企業在東南亞的發展：探討了臺灣企業在東南亞投資策略的轉變，特別是在全球化和中國區域影響下的挑戰，並分析了新南向政策如何應對供應鏈重組和美中緊張局勢。這表明新南向政策是臺灣在東南亞地區發展經濟關係的重要策略，但也面臨著來自中國的競爭壓力。
- 臺灣與越南的經濟合作關係：聚焦於臺越貿易與投資關係，認為新南向政策和臺灣在越南的長期投資是強化雙邊經濟關係的關鍵因素。這進一步佐證了新南向政策在促進臺灣與東南亞國家，特別是越南的經濟合作方面的重要性。
- 臺灣與東南亞的農業職業教育合作：比較研究探討了臺灣與東南亞農業職業教育的異同，提出了合作與改進的機會。這顯示臺灣在農業技術和教育方面具有優勢，可以與東南亞國家分享經驗，並在農業領域建立更緊密的合作關係。
- 印尼移工在臺灣的職業教育與賦權：著重於印尼移工在臺灣的職業教育，強調社區學習在提升移工自我能力及未來發展的重要性，但也指出現今培訓計畫的局限。這說明臺灣在印尼移工的培訓和賦權方面扮演著重要角色，同時也需要進一步改善相關計畫，以更好地滿足移工的需求。
- 臺灣的 LGBT 權利運動與亞洲價值觀：比較臺灣和越南的 LGBT 權利運動，指出兩國因深受亞洲價值觀影響，在同性婚姻合法化的進程上呈現不同發展，特別是臺灣成功合法化而越南尚未。這顯示臺灣在 LGBT 權



利議題上走在區域前列，並可能成為其他亞洲國家推動相關議題的參考對象。

- 儒家思想與臺灣教育的競爭力：臺灣教育減少對儒家思想的關注可能削弱市場競爭力，並認為儒家精神的自省對於政策評估和競爭力提升有益。這反映了臺灣社會中關於傳統文化與現代教育之間的辯論，以及儒家思想在當代社會中的角色和意義。
- 臺灣與東南亞的文化交流與教育合作：多篇文章探討了越南語教學的技巧和策略，特別是在臺灣和越南的教育機構中，如何有效地教授越南語，以及如何結合文化知識，提升學生的跨文化交際能力。這展現了臺灣與東南亞國家在語言和文化交流方面的密切合作，以及臺灣在推廣東南亞語言和文化教育方面所做的努力。

二、東南亞區域合作與挑戰：

- 東帝汶加入東協的挑戰：探討東帝汶在加入東協過程中面臨的困難，特別是其經濟弱勢和外交策略不足，以及在面對中國經濟影響時的權衡取捨。
- 印尼在區域合作中的角色：強調印尼作為東協與 G20 之間合作橋樑的潛力，並指出印尼在推動地方政府間外交合作方面的重要性。
- 東協內部認同建構的困境：分析東協在建構社會文化共同體時面臨的內部分歧和挑戰，指出區域整合過程中存在的碎片化和利益分歧問題。

三、各國政治動態與領導風格：

- 緬甸政變後的政治局勢：分析2021 年緬甸政變後的政治動態，特別是在東協框架下如何處理區域衝突與國際壓力，以及泰國與緬甸之間的外交關係。
- 菲律賓的民主發展與挑戰：探討菲律賓的民主化進程，包括直接民主的實踐、民粹主義修辭對氣候政策的影響，以及杜特爾特總統的領導風格和中央與地方政府關係。
- 印尼的發展型國家政策：分析印尼總統佐科威如何透過基礎建設和資源



民族主義重振印尼的發展型國家政策，並強調了國家在經濟中的干預角色。

- 泰國的憲政改革: 探討泰國自 2017 年憲法以來的憲政改革挑戰，特別是在軍政府遺留的政治架構下，憲法修正的困難與持續進行的公投和改革努力。
- 韓國與日本的歷史與政治文化關係: 探討韓國與日本之間的歷史恩怨以及現代政治文化中的合作與緊張關係，並從民族性和現代性角度進行分析。

四、旅遊發展與社會文化影響:

- 宗教與文化在旅遊發展中的角色: 以印尼巴里阿曼市為例，強調了宗教與文化在旅遊政策中的重要性，並探討如何在非西方背景下發展旅遊業。
- 國家、企業與社會在旅遊發展中的權力動態: 以印尼龍目島曼達利卡賽車場的建設為例，探討了國家、企業與社會之間在旅遊發展過程中的權力動態和利益衝突，特別是土地徵收對當地社區的影響。
- 旅遊文學與國家社會應對危機: 分析印尼文學作品中關於旅遊的敘述，探討了在新冠疫情期間，國家與社會如何共同應對危機，推動旅遊業的韌性和可持續性。

五、社會行為與動態:

- 數位資本主義與青年參與: 分析印尼年輕人在數位空間中的參與，特別是如何在 YouTube 等平臺上實踐數位資本主義，以及衝動消費與財務知識對其消費行為的影響。
- 菲律賓政治中的身份認同與憤怒情緒: 探討菲律賓政治中 "DDS" 和 "Dilawan" 這兩個群體的標籤及其身份認同，指出憤怒情緒在塑造這些身份認同中的作用，以及這些身份認同的流動性和複雜性。
- 文學作品對社會問題的反映: 以菲律賓宿霧詩人 Adonis Durado 的作品為主題，指出其詩歌反映了家庭暴力、食物短缺和無家可歸等社會問題，並探討了文學作為社會批判工具的功能。

五、經濟政策與發展:



- 越南的國家主導工業化政策: 探討了越南的國家主導工業化政策，分析了政府支持國有企業的策略及其效果，並指出了利益集團政治對政策實施的影響。
- 菲律賓的社會團結經濟: 以菲律賓的 Gawad Kalinga Enchanted Farm 為例，展示了社會團結經濟的成功經驗，強調了社會責任治理和環境保護在可持續發展中的重要性。
- 東南亞國家的市場自由化: 比較新加坡、越南和菲律賓在市場自由化過程中的表現，探討了不同的經濟結構如何影響社會和經濟發展，特別是在 GDP 增長和社會福利方面的差異。
- 越南的反中民族主義: 分析越南的反中民族主義，探討了其對國家與社會關係的影響，並以 2008 年中部高地鋁土礦項目和 2018 年反對經濟特區法的社會運動為例，說明了國家與社會在應對中國問題時的互動變化。

六、文化遺產與社會發展:

- 文化遺產的價值與協商: 以越南順化的 Nam Giao 儀式為例，探討了文化遺產在復興過程中面臨的挑戰及其文化價值的協商問題，並質疑這些儀式是重新創造還是全新創造的。
- 文化外交與國際關係: 探討了印尼香料之路在促進文化外交和國際關係中的歷史角色，並指出印尼如何利用其文化遺產加強與其他國家的聯繫。
- 傳統儀式與生態文化: 以印尼天格族的 Unan-unan 儀式為例，說明了傳統儀式如何在傳承文化的同時，也體現了環保與社區和諧的理念。
- 社會運動與財政抵抗: 分析緬甸政變後的社會運動，特別是財政抵抗策略如何在反抗軍事政權的過程中發揮作用，以及市場力量與社會運動之間的互動關係。

七、越南語教學:

- 提升越南語聽力技巧的策略: 探討了國學生在學習越南語聽力時面臨的挑戰，並提出了多種改善聽力技巧的教學策略，例如加強語音訓練和增加實際交流機會。



- 語言行為在越南語教學中的應用: 聚焦於語言行為，特別是如何在越南語教學中有效傳授表達性語言行為，例如問候、感謝、道歉等，並提出了基於溝通導向的教學方法。
- 詞彙教學與文化背景: 強調針對中文母語者的越南語教學中，詞彙的分類與轉譯的重要性，以及文化與語言學習的交互影響。
- 跨文化交際能力的培養: 探討如何在臺灣的小學和中學中進行越南語教學，並提出了結合文化背景進行語言教學的策略，以提升學生的跨文化交際能力。
- 越南語隱喻與文化模型: 探討「頭」在越南語中的隱喻使用，強調文化模型對隱喻概念的影響，並提出了如何在越南語作為第二語言的教學中引入這些抽象概念。
- 越南語語義和語用問題: 聚焦於越南語中「lại」一詞的語義和語用問題，強調其複雜的使用方式，並提供了針對中文母語者的教學策略。
- 越南成語和俗語教學: 研究如何為臺灣學生教授越南成語和俗語，並分析了學生的學習態度和學習成效，提出了改進建議。

八、其他議題:

- 印尼移工的職業教育與賦權: 著重於印尼移工的職業教育，強調社區學習在提升移工自我能力及未來發展的重要性，但也指出了現今培訓計畫的局限。
- 東南亞的黃金簽證計畫: 探討印尼於 2023 年推行的黃金簽證計畫，此計畫旨在促進人員流動，吸引外資，並帶來經濟增長，但也面臨社會政治挑戰。
- 菲律賓北部的城鎮發展: 聚焦於菲律賓北部的城鎮發展，描述西班牙和美國在殖民時期如何透過城市化和農業擴展來整合地方自治區。
- 社交媒體在菲律賓和印尼選舉中的角色: 分析菲律賓和印尼選舉中，Marcos 與 Prabowo 如何利用社交媒體重塑形象，並通過歷史修正主義爭取選票。
- 印尼地方選舉中的競選策略: 探討 Prabowo 競選策略對 2024 年印尼地方選舉的影響，特別是吸引年輕選民，並透過個人品牌和輕鬆風格的



宣傳吸引大眾參與。

- 越南文化產業發展與社區參與: 探討越南文化產業的發展，指出自 2016 年以來，政府積極推動文化政策以促進經濟和提升國家軟實力。
- 菲律賓創意經濟的發展策略: 聚焦於菲律賓的創意城市，探討城市競爭力的政治經濟因素，並提出促進創意社群與基礎設施協同發展的策略。
- 印尼魚產品加工產業的社區參與: 探討印尼南蘇拉威西沿海女性通過社區參與擴展魚產品加工的方式，強調教育和數位化對於提高產品市場份額的重要性。
- ESG 評級對馬來西亞股市的影響: 檢視馬來西亞公司 ESG 評級對股市的影響，發現高環境表露可提高公司資訊透明度，降低股價與市場的聯動性，從而提升股市的穩定性。
- 17 世紀荷蘭與中國商人在東南亞的貿易競爭: 回顧 17 世紀荷蘭與中國商人在東南亞港口如摩鹿加、萬丹、巴達尼及柬埔寨的市場競爭，闡述荷蘭利用軍事力量建立壟斷，而中國商人依賴廣泛的貿易網絡來維持地位。
- 歐盟和東盟應對氣候變遷的合作: 比較了歐盟和東盟應對氣候變遷的政策，並以斯洛維尼亞與印尼為例，分析這兩個區域組織在氣候政策上的異同及潛在合作機會。
- 19 至 20 世紀三江移民在新加坡的發展: 分析 19 至 20 世紀三江移民在新加坡的發展，尤其他們如何從外來者逐漸融入當地華人社會，並通過與新加坡華商總會的合作取得非正式政治權力。
- 印尼移工在臺灣的經驗: 探討印尼移工在臺灣的經驗，透過焦點小組和訪談分析移工和雇主之間的敘事，揭示他們在融入臺灣社會過程中的身份建構。

以上眾多議題反映了東南亞地區在政治、經濟、社會和文化等方面的多樣性和複雜性。透過這些研究可望能深入地理解東南亞地區的發展趨勢和挑戰，並為相關政策制定和學術研究提供參考。

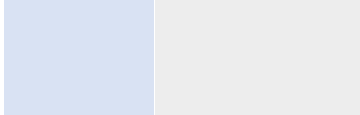

第四章 活動新聞報導

文藻舉辦國際學術研討會 聚焦東南亞發展與變遷

文藻外語大學東南亞學系日前舉辦第八屆「文藻東南亞研究國際學術研討會」，吸引來自美國、澳大利亞、瑞士、越南、泰國、印尼、馬來西亞、大陸及臺灣等地學者及專家齊聚，共同探討東南亞地區在「國家、市場、社會」現況、發展與變遷，總計發表 70 篇論文，吸引海內外逾 165 人參加。

此次會議的主題演講邀請馬來西亞雙威大學教授黃進發，以「民粹主義：不滿經濟、不信國家、裂解社會」為題進行分享。黃進發為馬來西亞知名學者及公共知識份子，他分析及評估東南亞民粹主義的興起，及其在政治、經濟、社會三個面向的影響。本屆研討會論文主題包括我國新南向政策、中國與東南亞關係、東南亞諸國民粹主義與民主現況、移民與海外工作者、泰國政經發展等議題。

文藻外大東南亞學系自 2017 年舉辦東南亞研究國際學術研討會（Wenzao Ursuline International Conference on Southeast Asian Studies, Wenzao Ursuline ICSEAS）迄今，每年皆吸引全球東南亞學者前來發表研究成果。尤其於新冠肺炎疫情期間，文藻東南亞學系仍然堅持在防疫規定許可下，持續舉辦實體發表的國際學術研討會，增進學者間的互動及交流。今年已是連續第 8 年舉辦，獲得在場學者高度肯定。來自菲律賓名校—菲律賓大學迪利門分校 Jorge Tigno 教授、印尼名校艾楞加大學 Vinsensio Marselino Dugis 教授，皆已參與盛會 5 次。

東南亞學系今年延續往例，於研討會中舉辦年度英文專書《東南亞：區域主義與其不滿者》發表會外，並舉辦「臺灣東南亞的研究與教學：顧長永教授的學術旅程」特別論壇，以「著作等身、桃李天下」向文藻東南亞學系顧長永教授致敬。顧長永教授是文藻東南亞學系成立、舉辦東南亞國際學術研討會，以及年度專書出版的重要幕後推手。



文藻外大東南亞研究國際學術研討會結束後，東南亞學系師生帶領與會各國學者進行「城市之旅」，走訪知名觀光工廠、地標性百貨公司，讓學者們深度瞭解高雄的城市發展。

第六章 成果效益

透過各國學者針對東南亞各國與東協之政策、現象、文學等面向的解析與比較，匯集於臺灣這個具地理優勢之小島。有鑑於東南亞在全球事務中的關鍵性正在快速上升，臺灣與東南亞國家，無論是進出口貿易、投資、人口移動亦是日益深厚。文藻外語大學東南亞學系邀請來自越南、印尼、泰國、馬來西亞、土耳其等在臺年青學者，一同探究東南亞諸國的政經情勢、區域關係及臺灣新南向政策，不僅增進參與各方對東南亞整體暨個別國家的認識與了解，也有助於國內外東南亞學術社群的建立，更藉著深化跨領域、跨文化的交流，為擴展臺灣與東南亞良好關係增添知識上的助力。

為延續本校辦理東南亞研討會的豐碩的成果，擬定研討會後出版一本論文英文專書。今年度專書將以《Southeast Asia: State vs Market vs Society》為題，邀請研討會發表者針對區域政治、政經、文化、國際關係等主題為文，促進臺灣對於東南亞事務研究之貢獻。此次辦理，於知識上，參加者發表論文並深度討論及對話，深化對學科知識的貢獻；學術發展上，與會者將合力深化立足於臺灣的東南亞研究。文藻大學與臺灣學術界將面向世界，展現自身成為全球東南亞事務之領航者的企圖與能力；實務意義上，與會者從諸多不同角度：跨領域、跨產業研討區域內現實議題，藉此可作為臺灣借鏡，並與創新產學實務連結。

綜觀本次研討會之辦理，可歸結以下成果：

- 第一、增進臺灣在東南亞學術研究的國際能見度與重要性。
- 第二、提升國內年輕學者對東南亞研究的興趣與動力。
- 第三、推廣國內學術界對東南亞的認識，深化跨文化的交流，以提升我國與東南亞的良好關係。
- 第四、促進國際學者對臺灣及大高雄地區的認識。
- 第五、建立文藻作為南臺灣東南亞學術和政策研究的重鎮，整合東南亞相關國家、大學的東南亞研究中心，成為跨國平臺。



財團法人臺灣民主基金會簡介

緣起與成立

臺灣民主轉型成功，不僅是兩千三百萬臺灣人民值得驕傲的歷史性成就，更是國際社會讚賞的焦點。此一轉型並非一朝一夕所能完成，而是經歷了一段漫長的爭自由、爭人權的過程。這段歷史見證吾人追求民主、人權之過程。

基此，為積極鞏固我國民主與人權進步實績、回饋國際對我長期的堅定支持與協助，同時藉由參與全球民主力量網路的聯繫，促進我國參與全球民主政黨及相關組織之活動，財團法人臺灣民主基金會之設立理念於焉成型。

外交部自二〇〇二年即積極推動籌設，經過長期資料蒐整及審慎評估後，結合我國產、官、學及民間等各方面人力、經驗與資金，在朝野各政黨之支持下，於二〇〇三年元月獲立法院審查通過預算。二〇〇三年六月十七日，財團法人臺灣民主基金會在召開首屆董事暨監察人會議後正式成立，立法院王院長金平獲推舉擔任首屆董事長。依照章程規定，十五位董事分別依照比例，由來自政府、政黨、學界、非政府組織，以及企業界的代表出任。

宗旨

做為亞洲地區所建立的第一個國家級民主基金會，臺灣民主基金會的基本理念是在全民共識的基礎上，建立一個永續經營、具遠景並運作透明化的超黨派機構，透過凝聚政黨、民間組織力量，共同為擴大臺灣參與全球民主接軌及鞏固民主實績而努力。

依照章程，基金會設立宗旨包括：

- 與民主國家相關社團、政黨、智庫及非政府組織（NGOs）等建構合作夥伴關係，並與國際民主力量接軌，有效凝集世界民主力量，拓展我國國際活動空間。
- 支持亞洲及世界各地之民主化，與全球各地民主領袖建立密切合作及聯繫網絡，並致力推動全球民主發展。
- 透過全球學術界、智庫、國會、政黨等管道推動民主教育及國際交流，提升臺灣民主素質，鞏固民主發展。

工作方向

財團法人臺灣民主基金會係由政府贊助設立，惟仍屬獨立運作的、超黨派的組織，依據章程，基金會得接受國內外民間捐款。基金會五分之一預算保留作為各主要政黨申請從事國內、外民主人權相關活動之用；其餘五分之四則作為推動各項業務之經費。

本會業務推動範圍包括：

- 推動與世界各國民主組織建立結盟關係。
- 支持國內外學術界、智庫、民間非政府組織推展有關民主與人權之活動。
- 支援國內各政黨從事國會外交及國際民主交流活動。
- 發掘國內外民主發展問題、研發政策並發行書刊。
- 推動有關民主、人權之研討會，舉辦公共論壇及相關民主教育活動。



Taiwan Foundation for Democracy

Background

Taiwan's peaceful transition to democracy is not only a historical accomplishment for its twenty-three million people, but a landmark in the worldwide spread of democracy. Only after years of struggle and effort could this transformation take place. We must never forget this history, for it shapes the cornerstone of our continued commitment to the principles of democracy and human rights.

The Foundation was established with an inter-related, two-tracked mission in mind. Domestically, the TFD strives to play a positive role in consolidating Taiwan's democracy and fortifying its commitment to human rights; internationally, the Foundation hopes to become a strong link in the world's democratic network, joining forces with related organizations around the world. Through the years, Taiwan has received valuable long-term assistance and stalwart support from the international community, and it is now time to repay that community for all of its efforts.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs initiated the Taiwan Foundation for Democracy project in 2002. After much research and careful evaluation, the Ministry integrated the required resources from many sectors of society. In January 2003, the Ministry obtained the support of all political parties to pass the budget for the Foundation in the legislature. The TFD formally came into being on June 17, 2003, with its first meeting of the Board of Trustees and Supervisory Board. At that meeting, Legislative Yuan President Wang Jin-pyng was elected its first chairman. According to its By-laws, the TFD is governed by a total of fifteen trustees and five supervisors, representing political parties, the government, academia, non-governmental organizations, and the business sector.

Mission

The Taiwan Foundation for Democracy (TFD) is the first democracy assistance foundation to be established in Asia, and is devoted to strengthening democracy and human rights in Taiwan and abroad. Its primary concerns are to further consolidate Taiwan's democratic system, promote democracy in Asia, and actively participate in the global democratic network.

The TFD will put its ideals into practice through farsighted, transparent, and non-partisan management. Building on the strength of both political parties and civil society, the TFD will enable Taiwan to positively contribute to the worldwide movement for democracy. According to its By-laws, the Foundation's mission is as follows:

Work with the international community to strengthen democracy around the globe and expand Taiwan's participation in international activities;
Support democratization in Asia and the rest of the world by establishing close relationships with leaders of the world's democracies and cooperative partnerships with civil society groups, political parties, think tanks, and non-governmental organizations in democratic countries; and
Elevate Taiwan's democracy and further consolidate its democratic development by promoting education in democracy and international exchanges among academic circles, think tanks, parliaments, and political parties from the world over.

Our Tasks

The primary source of funding for the TFD is the government. However, it is independently incorporated, non-partisan, and non-profit. According to its By-laws, the Foundation may accept international and domestic donations. One fifth of its budget is reserved for Taiwan's political parties, supporting their own international and local initiatives that are in line with the mission of the TFD. The remaining budget is used for the TFD core activities, including:

Building relationships with related institutions around the world;
Participating actively in the global promotion of democracy and supporting the improvement of human rights conditions;
Supporting democracy promotion activities of NGOs and academic institutions;
Promoting research and publications on democratic developments at home and abroad; and
Holding seminars, workshops, conferences, and other educational activities in the area of democracy and human rights.
