

Fr Roberto Chan Yap SJ assumed office as the 31st President of Ateneo de Manila University on 01 August 2020.



Events & Activities During the time of Pandemic

Since the time of pandemic, Soegijapranata Catholic University (SCU) has launched 25 books written by faculties, students, and staff. Among the published books are reflective books related with pandemic and books launched to commemorate certain events. The book entitled "21 Refleksi Pembelajaran Daring di Masa Darurat" is the first reflective book written by 21 faculties as a reflection on the first three weeks of conducting fully online classes due to covid-19 pandemic. During the time of pandemic, SCU also holds several events and activities in collaboration with its partner universities. In collaboration with Marian International Institute of Management (MIIM), SCU conducted a series of connecting classes on Cultural Exchange. The virtual classes have been conducted since May 2020 and followed by students from both institutions. Another collaborated project was in the form of choral collaboration between SCU and Christ deemed to be university, covering a devotional song, 10000 Reasons by Matt Redman. Awards & Achievements

SCU has received two awards from LEPRID (Institute of Indonesian and World Achievement Record) for its achievement in conducting 205 online poem reading on 5 May 2020 and for being the first university conducting a virtual graduation with face tracking technology (25 June 2020).

SCU received a grant from the Indonesian government for virtual student credit transfer program. Five students from SCU are taking online courses at Chang Jung Christian University, Tainan, Taiwan. The program starts in the second week of September 2020. Those students are taking six subjects for the autumn period at Chang Jung Christian University, Taiwan.


Universitas Katolik Widya Mandala Surabaya

International Probono Activity of ACU Law Students in Surabaya

A total of 10 students and 1 professor from Australian Catholic University (ACU), together with 5 students from Widya Mandala Surabaya Catholic University (WMSCU) and 5 students from Darma Cendika Catholic University (UKDC) Surabaya, carried out a trash cleaning activity of a river in Mojokerto, East Java, as shown in the picture. It was part of a community service collaborating with a local NGO, Ecological Observation and Wetlands Conservation, also known as Ecoton. Ecoton is an environmental activist organization, focusing on environmental restoration of rivers from pollution.

The ACU students were law students from Thomas More Law School and in Surabaya for two weeks in November 2019 as part of international pro-bono activity funded by New Colombo Plan from Australian government. While in Surabaya, students were learning about the law system in Indonesia (i.e., visiting the court building), culture of Indonesia (i.e., learning Bahasa Indonesia dan traditional musical instrument, and conducting social volunteer work with several NGOs.

Meeting with the Newly Admitted North Korean Refugee Students

On April 20, President Fr. Luke Jongchul Won, Ed.D. met with the newly admitted North Korean refugee students of 2020 at the school's VIP Reception Room.

In the welcoming meeting, President Won encouraged the students saying, "You shouldn't hesitate to ask your academic advisor for help regarding any personal and academic difficulties. Please keep in mind that the university will always be of support."

CUK started a scholarship program for North Korean defectors to help them settle in successfully in Korean society. Admitted students receive full tuition scholarship along with dormitory fee and living expense.

CUK Coping with Covid-19

During 2020 spring semester, CUK executed distance learning to prevent Covid-19 on campus grounds. Even though the pandemic had made the campus lose its usual vibrant atmosphere, a series of donations from students, faculties and companies showed that the spirit of share and love continued.

The contributions were distributed to students and local businesses to help them cope with the virus. In an effort to encourage the students, CUK decided to award a special scholarship to all enrolled undergraduates.

Graduation ceremony also had to be moved online, where 463 students were bestowed a degree. Photo walls and lifesize standees of President Fr. Luke Jongchul Won, Ed.D. were set up on campus for students and family members to celebrate their last moment at CUK.


Wenzao Ursuline University of Languages
